Linemen from three states competed on June 10-11 with various tasks that are a part of their work routine. They earned points for speed and accuracy, but were docked if construction guidelines and safety standards weren't met.

While the teams battled in Paris, those same linemen partnered with MLGW over a mutual

enemy – severe weather. Just days after the event, a storm barreled through Memphis on June 15 toppling trees and leaving 54,000 customers without power. With the help of linemen from Somerville, Brownsville, Jackson, TN, and Scottsboro and Russellville, AL, all power was restored within two days.

## Students plant wildflowers in MLGW power line corridor

Ten-year-old Arianna Wright wrinkled her nose when she and her team from Memphis Business Academy charter school spotted a slug among the wildflower seedlings.

"It was disgusting," she said. "Then I saw a worm. I held it and put it in the hole."

Arianna was among a group of 20 students who recently planted 200 seedlings along a section of power line right-of-way inside John F. Kennedy Park in Raleigh. Earlier, workers on a tractor with a seed drill scattered native grass and wildflower seeds in a 13-acre area near the park's ball fields.

MLGW's Commercial and Industrial Customer Care manager Bill Bullock. It likely will take two summers before the meadow is fully established with black-eyed Susans, purple coneflowers, milkweed and other wildflowers.

In addition to providing food and habitat for birds, bees and butterflies, the meadow will filter any runoff into the nearby Wolf River.

"Any day you get students outside experiencing nature is always a good day," said Clean Memphis co-founder Janet Boscarino who worked with the charter school students during a summer enrichment program.
