PRESIDENT'S BRIEFING (Continued):

- 2. HR Policy #22-22 Time Off for Death in Family or to Attend an Employee's Funeral <u>Rutha Griffin</u> stated that the policy language now adds three paid days off for still births for parents and grandparents. If travel over 500 miles is required, five days off are granted.
- 3. Smart Meter Project Chris Bieber reviewed MLGW's journey to Smart Meters. He stated as of December, 2016 MLGW has completed 20% deployment of the meters. He provided statistics stating that there are 156,828 ejectric meters, 22,991 gas meters and 31,831 water meters installed at this point. He described some of the steps that must take place prior to the installation of water meters. He addressed the various "moving parts" to accomplish all of the installations. He stated the meter installation is ahead of the planned schedule and noted that

Elster has done a great job and expects to complete all residential meter installations by the end of 2018. He discussed the easy access for customers to access information once their smart meters are installed. He discussed the "Prepay Option" and stated the Salt River Project in Arizona has the longest-running prepay service, showing the average household saves 12% in electricity. He noted that the opt-out rate is at 3.3%. Compared to other utility companies, MLGW does not charge an opt-out fee or manual meter reading fee.
