# PRESIDENT'S BRIEFING (Continued):

- 2. State of Procurement <u>Jozelle Booker</u> read the Proclamation from Governor Haslam proclaiming March as Procurement Month. The proclamation dated back to 2015; however, this is the first year MLGW has recognized Procurement Month. Ms. Booker provided various statistics such as total procurement spending and the number of purchase orders and contracts processed. She reported detailed supplier diversity statistics which included the spend with Shelby County businesses, as well as percentages pertaining to MBE, WBE, and LSB. She also introduced all of the employees in Purchasing, Contract Management, and Supplier Diversity. <u>President Collins</u> responded praising the staff for a job well done.
- 3. Corporate Scorecard Fourth Quarter, 2015 <u>Valerie McKinney</u> reported that MLGW had reached the highest score in the fourth quarter and the highest annual score of 97.4%. The JD Power score was 662, which exceeded the goal and the 9th year in a row that MLGW came in under budget in O&M.
