Honorable Mention

There are a number of ways we can help protect our Water Supply:

- Never put anything down a storm drain, wisely dispose of household and lawn/garden chemicals.
- Never pour hazardous wastes on the ground, in a storm drain or in an indoor drain.
- Consider using non-toxic alternatives to household and lawn chemicals.
- Washing your car at a car wash prevents the soap, polish, wax and other chemicals from entering the storm drain system.
- Think before you flush! Flushing unused or expired medicines can be harmful to our drinking water.
- Recycle used motor oil.

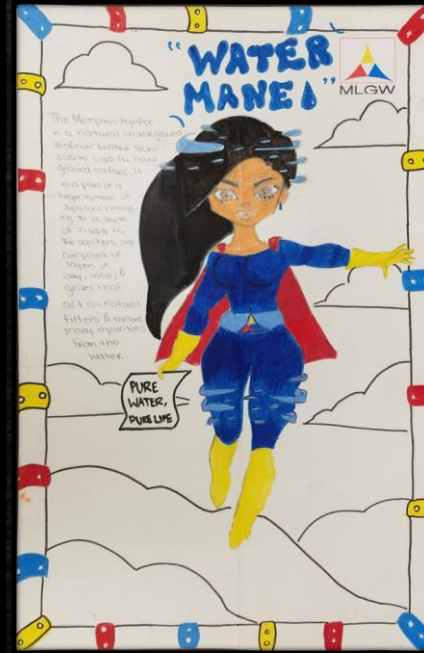

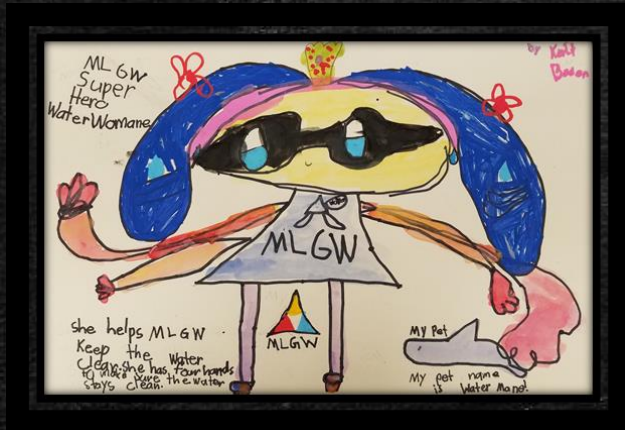

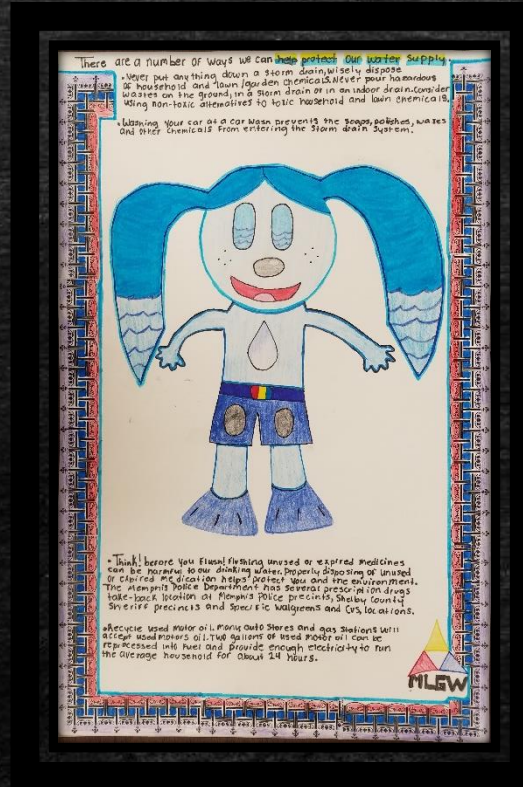
