

## Community Resources Offering Utility Assistance

- 1. Shelby County's Community Services Agency (CSA) distributes funds available through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LiHEAP). The CSA provides emergency and non-emergency assistance. For information and to apply visit: https://www.shelbycountycsa.org/services/energy-assistance.
  - NOTE: Residents who received assistance from the CSA between October 1, 2019 and today are not eligible to apply for assistance again until October 1, 2020.
- 2. The Metropolitan Inter-Faith Association (MIFA) provides one-time, emergency utility assistance through MLGW's Plus-1 program. Visit MIFA's website to read over qualifications and apply: mifa.org/applyonline.
  - a. The Memphis Mayor's Office in conjunction with the Memphis City Council provided an additional \$3.5 million in CARES Act funds for MIFA to distribute. Apply at <a href="mailto:mifa.org/applyonline">mifa.org/applyonline</a> or at your nearest Memphis Public Library.
- 3. A <u>Childcare Payment Assistance Program</u> is also available through the State of Tennessee. The program provides essential workers access to child care at no cost.
- 4. The YMCA of the Mid-South is offering live, virtual learning support for students. There is no cost for essential employees. Tutoring, meals and other activities are also available.
