



Community Resources Offering Utility Assistance

1. Shelby County's Community Services Agency (CSA) distributes funds available through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). The CSA provides emergency and non-emergency assistance. For information and to apply visit:

The Navy – Marine Corps Relief Society – NSA – Mid-South Base – Emergency Financial Assistance provides utility and other assistance for active duty and retired military personnel, their widows and spouses with power of attorney.
