National Safe Digging Month, You Dig?

April is National Safe Digging Month, a time when many homeowners, residents and contractors dig, excavate, build, landscape and garden. If there are plans to dig on your property at any time, whether it's for fence posts, trees, gardening, repairs, home addition or whatever, always call to get your utility lines located and marked first. Call 811, the national safe digging hotline, before you dig. It's better to be safe than sorry by calling and planning ahead.

MLGW, cable and phone companies will come out and mark your utility and gas lines for free. Always allow 72 hours (three business days) for your lines to be marked before any digging. Take a photo of the markings but call again for future digs.
