Public Notice: Regular board meetings are held the first and third Wednesdays of the month at MLGW's Administration Building unless otherwise noted in the public notice filing and website. The proposed agenda will be posted in the public section of the ground floor lobby of the Administration Building and on MLGW's website at least 48 hours before the Board meets. You may access the proposed Board agenda and all available documents related to the items linked from the agenda on the Internet at: www.mlgw.com. Large agreements, items related to Homeland Security or items received too late to post may not be viewable. You may view those documents in the Public Records Office prior to or after the Board meeting. By Board action, agenda items may be added, deleted or held for later consideration at a later board meeting.

The Manager of Procurement and Contracts recommends to the Board of Light, Gas, and Water Commissioners the approval of Renewal (*Change No. 11*) to Contract No. 10927, Perpetual Licensing Agreement with Precisely Software, Incorporated (*previously Pitney Bowes Software, Incorporated*) to increase the contract value in the funded amount of \$290,354.55.

The project scope is to provide software maintenance, license, and support services for the EngageOne Application and Composition Engine. The purpose of this software is to create or change bills and letters. The initial contract was for annual software maintenance, license, and support services. The contract award was selected based on the Single Source procurement process.

This change is to renew the annual software maintenance, license, and support services for the EngageOne Application, Composition Engine and Vault Repository for a five (5) year term covering the period December 29, 2025 through December 28, 2030 in the funded amount of \$252,482.22.
