PRESIDENT'S BRIEFING (Continued):

2. Other - President Doug McGowen

<u>President Doug McGowen</u> provided an update to the Board regarding the billing and meter exceptions that were discussed at the February 10, 2023 Board Meeting. President McGowen stated that 5,000 of the backlog bills would be going out by the end of today, February 15, 2023. 3,600 backlog bills have already been sent out. We are repairing an average of 1,600 meters each day. President McGowen conservatively hopes that the backlog will be addressed by end of next month. If it extends past that he hopes that it won't be much past that so we can get borrowed employees back to their normal positions, and making the billing and meter exceptions more manageable going forward.

<u>President Doug McGowen</u> also provided the Board with an update on the Call Centers answer times. President McGown stated that the average time to answer a call in January was 15 minutes. The average answer time for the past 30 days is 8 minutes 11 seconds and the median time to answer was 7 minutes and 14 seconds. President

McGowen says that Mr. Kenneth Culp is continuing to do good work managing the Call Center and making things better for our customers each day.
