2. Greater Memphis Chamber Presentation - Ted Townsend/Beverly Robertson

Greater Memphis Chamber Presentation - Mr. Ted Townsend, Chief Economic Development Officer joined the meeting via Zoom. Mr. Townsend provided an extensive overview of the notable growth of existing businesses and the attraction of new businesses to the city in 2021. He added that Memphis was recently ranked number one globally for logistics by Facilities Magazine. He stated that the Chamber's plan for retention and growth also includes workforce education that will put people back to work in jobs and positions with equitable wages.

All of the Board members were complimentary of the Chamber's work and its plan for future economic growth in Memphis.
