PRESIDENT'S BRIEFING CONT'D

Other - Doug McGowen

President McGowen reported to the Board that as of August 30, 2025, we have officially closed out our second year of cycle trimming for tree trimming. We have completed 145% of the Goal and we only have about 300 miles to go to complete our accelerated tree trimming cycle. President McGowen stated that this means that we will be able to realign our crews and get them on a regular cycle. President McGowen stated that as a result of this accelerated tree trimming cycle, we have reduced outages by 50%. President McGowen gave kudos to the team for coming up with a plan to accomplish this goal and gave kudos to the Board of Commissioners and City Leaders for supporting this accelerated tree trimming cycle. President McGowen reported that the next step to improve reliability is to modernize our grid. President McGowen laid out the next steps for that process. President McGowen reminded the audience about the Audit Committee Meeting immediately following the Board Meeting.
